Bellevue University offers many successful, highly regarded athletic programs including teams that are consistently ranked among the nation's elite. During our 2014-15 season, we gained our ninth-consecutive Midlands Collegiate Athletic Conference Commissioner's Cup, awarded annually to the conference's most successful athletic program.

Women's Soccer advanced to the NAIA National Tournament for the fifth-straight season after capturing the MCAC Tournament championship to go along with the conference regular season title, finishing with a No. 21 final national ranking.

Men's Soccer qualified for the NAIA National Tournament for the second-straight season after capturing both the MCAC regular season and tournament championships. After an NAIA opening round win over Hastings, men's soccer finished with the program's highest final national ranking at No. 11.

Softball won the MCAC Tournament and regular season titles, advancing to the NAIA National Tournament for the eighth time in school history and the fifth time in the last six years, securing a No. 24 final national ranking.

Volleyball secured a 22-win season and reached the MCAC semifinals for the 11th-straight season.

Baseball made its 18th trip to the NAIA National Tournament after capturing the MCAC Tournament title, nailing down a No. 16 final national ranking.

Women's Golf won the MCAC Tournament title for the fourth-consecutive year, advancing to the NAIA National Championships for the third-straight season, finishing No. 7 in the nation.

Men's Golf, in only its fourth season, qualified for the NAIA National Tournament for the fourth-straight year after winning the MCAC Tournament title.

Men's Basketball finished the season ranked No.14 in the nation and advanced to its 13th-straight trip to the NAIA National Basketball Tournament after winning its sixth-consecutive MCAC regular season title along with the MCAC Tournament championship.

In 2015 Bellevue had five coaches named MCAC Coach of the Year: Matt Briggs | Men's Soccer • Andy Nicolarsen | Women's Soccer
Michala Cimino | Softball • Rob Brown | Men's Golf • Shelly Liddick | Women's Golf

Looking ahead

To start the 2015-16 season, Bellevue University will be moving from the MCAC to compete in the North Star Athletic Association. We will also be adding a ninth sport, women's basketball, which will begin competing during the 2016-17 season.

A total of **51 Bruin student-athletes** earned all-MCAC honors, and 14 individuals earned MCAC Player of the Year awards in their respective sports, in 2015.
